
Sister Act is inviting the congregation to donate any of the following items for the Care Kits:

- Small bottles of hand sanitizer


There is a box in the Narthex for the donations. Thank you for your help!!

The too few sprinkles during the afternoon did nothing to relieve the drought nor dampen the spirits of the 30 volunteers on Thursday. The 172 families kept everyone busy as we gave away everything from cantaloup to grapes. Fifth-graders Livy and Harper ("family/friends") did a great job of distributing the paper products and remaining school supplies. We served 584 people, with 53 new families matching the number in July—as did the number of children: 191. There were 53 seniors. Thanks to all of you for your tremendous generosity in giving the extras and donating your time. You ARE the hands of God!

Support for Berwick School

Over the years Redeemer has found a variety of ways to help needy students and families at Berwick Alternative Elementary School. We've offered holiday baskets, provided school uniforms, and even sponsored two families with gift cards at Christmas one year. We've been generous!

Recently the Outreach Team connected with the school principal once again to see whether Redeemer might be of assistance. She shared that last year she had eight students in shelters and one family from Haiti, so the needs have been many. She also stressed that all of our previous efforts have been greatly appreciated.

We discussed a number of possible approaches and concluded that the simplest way to help would be for Redeemer to hold on to any contributions and then let her refer any families in need directly to us. She was sure there would be requests for help with uniforms and other back-to-school costs.

So once again, let's live into our mission and our values by supporting families in need at Berwick School. Any contributions should be designated for the Berwick School Fund, and just as a guide, Dave and Joanie Engel remember that uniforms cost about \$30 six years ago. So, since school is starting as you're reading this, let's try to be both generous and speedy.



Thrive! Update

Julie Johnson reports, "Last year individuals at Redeemer joined many across the Southern Ohio Synod in pledging support through the synod's Thrive! campaign, which continues to fund several new resources of the SOS. Thrive! is a three-year campaign and Redeemer pledges totaled just over \$34,000!

"As of last month we have topped \$17,000 (combined last year and seven months of this year.) Each month we forward to the synod the amount received the previous month.

"Redeemer greatly benefited from the expertise we received to livestream our services as part of early Thrive! ministry expansion. Keep those pledges coming!"

Update on Palestine and Gaza

The following update is provided by **Julianne Johnson**:

"Ceasefire talks resumed last Thursday. The United States is sent several key administrative personnel to the area last week and Secretary of State Blinken is to return to the area to try to ensure that hostilities don't escalate. It is widely agreed that a ceasefire agreement must be reached if there is any possibility to avoid an Iranian military action against Israel. Iran has said that Israel will pay for the assassination of a Hamas leader who was visiting Tehran when he was killed.



Ceasefire talks did not include a Hamas representative, but talks included Egypt, Qatar, the United States and Israel to work on issues that divided the parties. Talks ended with news that progress had been made and that experts would continue this week to work on technical language and then the talks will resume late this week.

Bombings and fighting continue in Gaza. Israel regularly calls for evacuations of parts of Gaza that it was supposed to be a humanitarian zone. Sewage and water infrastructure were destroyed by Israel months ago so conditions for disease are rampant. Humanitarian aid remains far below needed levels, and aid trucks continue to be backed up in Egypt because of Israeli restrictions.

The acknowledged death toll now tops 40,000 in Gaza, although the actual casualties are considered to be much higher - some estimates now near 200,000. - or nearly 10 percent of the entire population of Gaza are now dead." Israel claims over 17,000 of the 40,000 deaths are militants, which means that 23,000 are civilians. Experts state that still means that 20,000 Hamas fighters remain. Netanyahu's stated goal is to eliminate Hamas – a goal that even the Israeli defense minister has said is unrealistic.

War with Iran would be a huge escalation of this fight, potentially involving the United States and other nations. Pray, and advocate for a ceasefire, return of hostages from both sides and justice for Palestinians.

Prayer Concerns from ELCA

August 20 Remember children and youth who will soon begin a new academic year; pray that they are filled with anticipation and will feel safe, cared for and supported by their parents, teachers and peers.

- 21 "Beautiful music is the art of the prophets that can calm the agitations of the soul," wrote Martin Luther. "It is one of the most magnificent and delightful presents God has given us." Praise God for the gift of music in your daily life and when you gather for worship.
- 22 Remember in prayer pastors and deacons discerning God's call to service and accepting calls to new places where they are needed. Pray for the Spirit to open their hearts, give them wisdom and strengthen their families during their moves and transitions.
- 23 Pray for the work of Sumud: For Justice in Palestine and Israel (formerly Peace Not Walls), a new ELCA initiative of accompaniment, advocacy and awareness-raising with our partners in the Holy Land and in the United States, that together we will find the justice required for peace in the Middle East.
- 24 Pray for youth and adults who experienced the ELCA Youth Gathering and related events, that they will bear spirited witness far and wide to God's love and presence in the world and that the Spirit will continue to nourish their faith and identity as bold disciples of Christ.
- 25 "Jesus asked the twelve, 'Do you also wish to go away?' Simon Peter answered him, 'Lord, to whom can we go? You have the words of eternal life. We have come to believe and know that you are the Holy One of God'" (John 6:66-69). Ask the Spirit to renew and strengthen our faith in Jesus Christ, the living Word of God, especially when we grapple with the hard sayings of Jesus and wonder how to live by the gospel.
- **26** Give thanks for Sunday school teachers, volunteers, Bible study leaders and faith formation coordinators, who share their faith, time and gifts to build up the church and equip all ages for our baptismal journey of witness and service.
