

- "Don't begin by traveling to some far-off place to convert unbelievers. And don't try to be dramatic by tackling some public enemy. Go to the lost, confused people right here in the neighborhood. Tell them that the kingdom is here. Bring health to the sick. Raise the dead. Touch the untouchables. Kick out the demons. You have been treated generously, so live generously.
- "Don't think you have to put on a fund-raising campaign before you start. You don't need a lot of equipment. You are the equipment, and all you need to keep that going is three meals a day. Travel light.
- "When you enter a town or village, don't insist on staying in a luxury inn.

  Get a modest place with some modest people, and be content there until you leave.
- "When you knock on a door, be courteous in your greeting. If they welcome you, be gentle in your conversation. If they don't welcome you, quietly withdraw. Don't make a scene. Shrug your shoulders and be on your way."

Jesus invited all who were hungry for food, healing, justice, and joy to share this communion meal. Since this is his meal, and he is present to us in it, all are welcome.



### **Great Thanksgiving**




God, you are before all things; you are beyond all things; and in the midst of all things and all peoples you have made yourself known.

# **Sharing the Meal**


The gifts of God, for the people of God. Jesus welcomed all to this meal. So do we.


