
Reading Jeremiah 31:31-34 (New Revised Standard Version) A reading from the prophet Jeremiah



In sovereign love God created the world good
and makes everyone equally in God's image
to live as one community.
Ignoring God's commandments,
we violate the image of God in others and ourselves,
accept lies as truth,

Yet God acts with justice and mercy to redeem creation. In everlasting love,

God makes us heirs with Christ of the covenant.



Jesus invited all who were hungry for food, healing, justice, and joy to share this communion meal. Since this is his meal, and he is present to us in it, all are welcome.



Great Thanksgiving




God, you are before all things; you are beyond all things; and in the midst of all things and all peoples you have made yourself known.







Deadline for boards to receive *mail-ballots* that have been postmarked on or before November 4: November 9
