Pastor Dave will return from Sabbatical this coming **Sunday, Nov. 10**. The congregation Sunday thanked **Pastor Brad** for serving as interim pastor over the last three months with special post-service snacks and a gift.

Remembering Garden Going Forward

“The dedication of the first phase of the Remembering Garden was a truly meaningful conclusion to Sunday’s service. The idea for such a space had first been introduced and supported at a congregational meeting many years ago and had been percolating ever since. Now that there’s a physical presence, and not just a vague concept, it’s time to involve more folks in the continuing process of developing and then maintaining our garden,” writes **Mary Benis**. “Numerous areas will need to be planned and overseen:



- “**Design**—The next step will be to consider the landscape design the contractor provides and then tailor it to our preferences.

- “**Landscape care**—The landscape decisions will probably include some elements that will need to be monitored—maybe pruned, sprayed, cut back annually, etc.

- “**Hardscape**—The paved area will need to be monitored, maybe cleaned off, and the water pump turned on and off seasonally.

- “**Memorial Book**—The book of tribute pages for those whose cremains have been scattered or buried in the main garden area will need to be designed, selected, and maintained.

- “**Statuary**—Perhaps there should be a cross of some sort in the main scattering area and maybe an appropriate statue of some sort in the smaller area reserved for our pets. These would need to be selected and acquired.

- “**Signage**—There should be some visible indication of the garden’s identity and purpose—maybe a plaque or two of some sort? Again, these would need to be selected and acquired.

- “**Policies**—Every new space or activity needs thoughtful policies and procedures to guide it. These need to be considered and implemented sooner rather than later.

- “**Financial support**—The plan has been to encourage members and friends of Redeemer to “sponsor” parts of the landscape design. Those opportunities would need to be determined and then communicated to the congregation.

“Lots to think about for a seemingly small space but one imbued with lots of meaning!

“As with all other ministries at Redeemer, the most effective programs are those with broad support. So please consider how you’d like to participate. Involvement could be short- or long-term, area-specific or general -- you decide. And then let one of the current team members know – **Mary Benis, Brad Binau, Michele Disbro, Kathy Mimitch, Dave Shull, or Linda Williams**. Questions, concerns, or suggestions are also always welcome.”

Dinners Return to First English!! Redeemer to Serve Nov. 21

On **Thursday, November 21**, Redeemer is scheduled to provide the dinner at First English. The menu will be: Sloppy Joe sandwiches, individual chip snack bags, fruit cups, individually wrapped Hostess desserts and granola bars. There will be lemonade and water also available for the dinners.

According to **Coordinator Kay Ernsthansen**, “We will need enough food for 150 dinners, Today I am giving you all the heads up this is starting. Dinner will be served from 5:30 to 6:30 p.m. We will need to be at First English at between 4:30 and 4:45 p.m.

“We will need people to make Sloppy Joes. (2 lbs of ground meat into Sloppy Joes) – please let Kay know if you will be donating sloppy joes and we will make arrangements for pick up on Thursday, Nov. 21 so they are hot. I will also need 150 hamburger buns for the sloppy joes. We will also need five or six people to serve.

“Also, there is a change coming in doing dinners in that sack lunches will be handed out for people to take with them. For November, Redeemer is only providing the dinner and serving. Another organization is providing the sack lunches.

“Those considering making Sloppy Joes, here is a recipe from **Kathy Mimplitch** that has been used in the past. Thank you all for your commitment to this ministry!”

2 lbs lean ground beef
1/2 cup chopped onion
1/2 cup chopped green pepper
1 tsp garlic powder
2 tsp prepared yellow mustard
1 1/2 cups ketchup
6 tsp brown sugar
Salt and pepper to taste

“In a medium skillet over medium heat, brown the ground beef, onion and green pepper. Drain off liquids Stir in garlic powder, mustard, ketchup and brown sugar. Mix thoroughly. Reduce heat and simmer for 30 minutes. Season with salt and pepper. This makes ~ 12 servings

“I usually omit the green pepper (I don’t like it)! I sometimes use ketchup and barbecue sauce instead of just ketchup. I almost double the brown sugar as I like it sweet. Recipe can be made with turkey.”

Engel Provides Overview of Special Funds Team Purpose, Activities

Special Funds Team (SFT) Chair Dave Engel writes that the team, approved by the congregation in 2018, supervises the investment of each fund (Mission Endowment Fund, Memorial and Special Gifts Fund that includes the Memorial Fund, and the Mary Kohler Ministry Fund, and the RLC Building and Equipment Fund) as “entrusted to it by the congregation. These monies are currently invested in the Columbus Foundation. Interest earnings from the total investment are distributed proportionate to the amount in the individual funds.

“The **Mission Endowment Fund** provides for mission work beyond the operating budget of RLC. A percentage (4 percent) of the annual earnings are distributed annually” for the following purposes:

- “Establish and support ministries of outreach within or on behalf of the congregation.
- “Further partnerships in mission through the synodical, regional and national expressions of the ELCA.
- “To support capital improvements, debt retirement a building program of RLC when circumstances warrant. Forms to suggest recipients of this year’s distribution are forthcoming.

“Suggestions for unrestricted **Memorial Gift** funds are made to the SFT which will then make a recommendation to the Congregation Council.

“The **Mary Kohler Ministry Fund** is an unrestricted fund created by gifts from **Mary Kohler** and an anonymous donor. Applications for educational purposes and for new or existing RLC neighborhood ministries receive priority. The Congregation Council determines disbursements. A suggestion for distribution of money from

the Mary Kohler Ministry Fund are made to the SFT which may recommend a distribution of funds to the Congregational Council. Actual distribution is at the direction of the Congregation Council.

“The **RLC Church Building and Equipment Fund** funds the capital expenditure needs that exceed the congregation’s annual budget. Additions to and distributions from this fund are controlled by the Congregation and the Congregation Council. The funds are distributed at the direction of the Congregation Council.”

In addition to Dave, members of the Special Funds Team are **Wendy Stoica**, treasurer; **Terry Warren**, secretary; **Ashley Bird**; and **Julie Boreman**.

Stewardship Looks at Building as Asset for Ministry

Redeemer’s Property Team Leader **April Smith**, in her presentation on the Stewardship theme of “Together Creating Something Greater than Ourselves,” told the congregation, “The church is not a building but a church building is a valuable asset used by a congregation in ministry to the community.

“You may not realize it but we are landlords and are responsible for the safety and security of our long time tenants, Suzuki Music School. We have a wonderful relationship with them and I can’t think of a better use of the education wing of the building than to bring the joy of learning music to children and their families.

“We also have several support and community groups who make use of our building for their meetings. Our parking lot is used for basketball camp and our various food giveaway days. The courtyard provides a perfect space for a garden that yields produce we freely share with our neighbors. These are important ministries that make use of our property.

“Maintaining our campus is a quiet ministry with noticeable results. While it is true that we pay for some outside services like lawn care, snow removal, and pest control and we have a wonderful part time custodian, the responsibility to care for our property lies with each one of us. Behind the scenes, we must insure that all of our safety and fire, heating and cooling, and elevator systems are serviced and inspected. We coordinate for repairs and maintenance jobs to be completed.

“All of these tasks are accomplished by volunteers who spend time here on our campus helping to make sure our building and property can serve us well in ministry to our community. We can always use more hands to share the load so please ask about what you might be able to help with. Let’s think about the future - not just for 2025 but perhaps three, five, 10 or even 20 years ahead – and dream about what ministry from this corner of Berwick might look like for generations to come.”

‘Noisy Offering’ Going to Lutheran Disaster Response

The Wider Church Palestine Update

The following update is provided by **Julianne Johnson**:

“Last week, Israel killed **Yahya Sinwar**, the head of Hamas who was central to planning the October 7 massacre in Israel. He was the last of three leaders of Hamas that Israel had targeted - all three had been charged with war crimes by the International Criminal Court, which also charged **Israeli Prime Minister Netanyahu** and the Israeli Defense Minister for war crimes in the destruction and death in Gaza.

“Israel continues its war in Gaza as well as its extensive bombing in Lebanon, where Hezbollah - a terrorist group supported by - Iran is based.

“**President Joe Biden** and **Vice President Kamala Harris** have urged Israel to pursue a ceasefire and release of the hostages now that Yahya Sinwar has been killed. While Netanyahu seems determined to continue expanding the war, it is hard to imagine that the remaining hostages can continue to live through escalating conflict and the devastating and worsening conditions in Gaza.

Prayer Concerns from ELCA

November 5 Election Day: “The right hand of God is planting in our land, planting seeds of freedom, hope, and love” (*ELW* 889). Ask the Spirit to help us exercise concern for our neighbor, the well-being of communities, and racial, gender and economic justice as we discern whom to elect as our leaders and public servants. Give thanks for *ELCA*votes, an initiative to help us understand our role in promoting dignity and respect for all.

6 Pray for the Spirit to inspire us to share the good news of Jesus Christ and teach every generation about God’s word, loving ways and active presence in the world, today and throughout history.

7 National Homeless Youth Month: Remember and pray for young people who have no shelter or place where they feel safe, secure and cared for. Pray for community programs and ministries of our church that provide shelter, food, resources and support for developing self-sufficiency, and physical, emotional and spiritual care for youth.

8 Give thanks for the joy and certainty we experience when we walk in God’s ways and follow God’s commandments as revealed to us in Scripture and the life and teachings of Jesus Christ.

9 Pray for those in the Gulf Coast and other regions of the Southeast who are grieving loss and recovering from the devastation of Hurricanes Helene and Milton. Pray that their hope, faith and determination will remain strong and that we will offer generous support and assistance through Lutheran Disaster Response, communities of faith, volunteers and disaster recovery agencies — for as long as needed.

10 Pray for outdoor ministry leaders gathering for the Leadership Training Event and Lutheran Outdoor Ministries conference in Baltimore, MD. Ask God to equip and renew them for ministry with people of all ages, abilities and backgrounds.

11 Veterans Day: This is a day when we remember, honor and give thanks for the service and sacrifice of veterans of the armed forces who have defended our country and worked for freedom and justice in the world. Pray that their families, caregivers and survivors will receive the support and care they need. Give thanks for the work of Federal Chaplaincy Ministries of the ELCA and of congregations with ministries serving veterans and their families.

The Community Beyond Election Day Finally Arrives on Tuesday

Hours for in-person voting at local polling places on **Tuesday, Nov. 5** will run from 6:30 a.m. to 7:30 p.m. For those who chose to vote via an absentee ballot, they must be postmarked by Monday, Nov. 4 or delivered directly to the local board of elections by 7:30 p.m. on Tuesday, Nov. 5.

Once their ballot request is received by their county board of elections, voters may track their ballot at <http://VoteOhio.gov/Track>. As long as a ballot is postmarked by the day before the election, **Monday, Nov. 4**, and received by **Saturday, Nov. 9**, the vote will be tabulated. There is no in-person voting on **Monday, Nov. 4** as boards of elections staff prepare for the Tuesday election.
