





We are members of one family,







Commitment to Keep the Dream of Love Alive

When he was in his late twenties, Carl Wendell Hines, Jr., wrote this poem soon after the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., was murdered. His painfully honest words remind us how easily Dr. King's dream of the beloved community can become a "dead man's dream." As those who follow Jesus, we commit ourselves to resist any who seek to convince us loving our neighbor as we love ourselves is optional. As followers of Jesus, we will keep the dream of love alive by making it real every day.

Now that he is safely dead, let us praise him, build monuments to his glory sing hosannas to his name. Dead men make such convenient heroes; they cannot rise to challenge the images we would fashion from their lives. And besides. it is easier to build monuments than to make a better world. So, now that he is safely dead we, with eased consciences, will teach our children that he was a great man...knowing that the cause for which he lived is still a cause and the dream for which he died is still a dream. a dead man's dream.



Great Thanksgiving

It is right to give our thanks and praise.


It is indeed right and good to remember that, in a refugee child playing under a star, in an unknown young man requesting baptism, in a wandering preacher refreshed by water from a woman's hand, God was waiting to be recognized and known, to transform seeing and change the world.

In the routine smallness of everyday life, in the painful uncertainty of struggle and transition, in the timeless grace of hospitality, and the gifts of bread and wine, God is waiting to be recognized and known, to transform our seeing and change our world.

Here, at this table, under the welcoming light of a morning star, the God of epiphanies waits to be encountered. So – though you may be weary and worn by your journey or stained and sore with travel – look up and see the star, lay aside your packs, and enter with joy for God waits here: to refresh and renew, to comfort and restore, to challenge and transform, to know, and be known.

Now, gathered around this table, we recall and recount how the Epiphany God appeared in the actions and words of Jesus as he shared a last supper with his friends in which Jesus took bread, blessed it, broke it, and gave it to his friends, saying, "Take this and eat. This is my body, broken for you. Do this to remember me." And after supper, Jesus took the cup and gave it to them, saying, "This cup is the new covenant sealed in my blood. It is shed for you and for all people for the forgiveness of sins. As often as you drink this, do so to remember me."

Recalling and treasuring these things, we join our voices with those of all creation to recognize and celebrate the grace and goodness of God present and at work in the world.



Epiphany God, send down your Holy Spirit now on us, and on these gifts of bread and wine – that we might recognize and know you present with us here, and in receiving the gifts of your love find ourselves renewed. By this meal, renew our commitment to make real the prayer Jesus teaches:

Lord's Prayer

Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name. Your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as in heaven. Give us today our daily bread.

Forgive us our sins as we forgive those who sin against us. Save us from the time of trial and deliver us from evil. For the kingdom, the power, and the glory are yours, now and forever. Amen.


