



The Holy Gospel according to St. Luke

Glory to you, O Lord.

When [Jesus and the disciples] came down from the mountain [where they had been praying], the disciples stood with Jesus on a large, level area, surrounded by many of his followers and by the crowds. There were people from all over Judea and from Jerusalem and from as far north as the seacoasts of Tyre and Sidon. Great Thanksgiving

The Lord be with you.


Lift up your hearts.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

And also with you. We lift them to the Lord.

It is right to give our thanks and praise.

It is indeed right and joyful that we give thanks and praise to you, merciful God. So we join our voices with those of all creation to recognize and celebrate your grace and goodness present and at work in the world.



Holy God, we remember how, in a refugee child playing under a star, in an unknown young man requesting baptism, in a wandering preacher refreshed by water from a woman's hand, you appeared to call creation to see themselves and each other with fresh compassion and kindness.

And today, in the routine smallness of everyday life, in the painful uncertainty of struggle and transition, in the timeless grace of hospitality, and the gifts of bread and wine, you appear to awaken us, to refresh and renew, to comfort and restore, to challenge and transform, to know, and be known.

Now, Epiphany God, gathered around this table, we recall how you, appeared in the actions and words of Jesus as he shared a last supper with his friends in which Jesus took bread, blessed it, broke it, and gave it to his friends, saying, "Take this and eat. This is my body, broken for you. Do this to remember me." And after supper, Jesus took the cup and gave it to them, saying, "This cup is the new covenant sealed in my blood. It is shed for you and for all people for the forgiveness of sins. As often as you drink this, do so to remember me."

Send down your Holy Spirit now on us, and on these gifts of bread and wine – that we might recognize and know you present with us here, and in receiving the gifts of your love find ourselves renewed. By this meal, renew our commitment to make real the prayer Jesus teaches:






How Churches Are Called to Respond to Sexual Violence


