# **MOFC Notifies RLC of End of Food Giveaways**

As reported in the March 10 issue of *Reflections*, the Mid-Ohio Food Collective (MOFC) notified Redeemer of the end of the monthly produce giveaways. Here is the letter from MOFC's **Kerry McCarthy** and **Brad Draper**, notifying RLC of that decision:

"Dear Partner,

"At MOFC, we deeply appreciate our partners that have hosted regular Produce Markets. Unfortunately, we find ourselves at a crossroads where we need to make some changes to this program.

"When produce markets began, nearly 15 years ago, there were few opportunities to access fresh fruit and vegetables in our network. All of our produce markets helped create a space in communities for customers to access produce and to improve the health of their households. Over the past 15 years, our entire network became aware of this demand and started to incorporate more fresh food for their customers – to the point where 65 percent of the product MOFC now distributes is fresh food.

"One advantage of other partners adapting to the focus on fresh food, is that most provide weekly access for customers, instead of once or twice per month. From the perspective of the customer, regular access provides a much more convenient way to provide these products.

"At the same time, our ability to provide fresh food has been dramatically impacted by supply challenges. These have been disruptions to the supply of eggs, citrus and other key crops recently. Over the past 16 months, MOFC has experienced delivery cancellations for more than \$2 million in federal food commodities that would have been available at no cost to MOFC and our partner agencies. Unfortunately, with rising costs and reduced supplies, we have to make changes in how we allocate the produce that is available.

"At MOFC, we are constantly evaluating our operations to ensure that we are providing excellent customer service and being the best possible stewards of the resources provided to us by our community. Because of the proliferation of fresh food availability throughout our network and the reduction in product availability, it makes sense for us to focus limited resources in those places with the most hours of access.

"Because of these factors, we will no longer provide produce to your produce market after Feb. 28, 2025. Please let your volunteers and customers know.

"We understand that you have made a great contribution to your community by hosting your produce market, and we hope that you are very proud of that. You can still play a vital role in connecting customers to food resources, since with the <a href="FreshTrak.com">FreshTrak.com</a> website, it is much easier to know on any given day the location and time of pantries and meal programs.

"This is a difficult message to send, because we know that your organization's heart and soul has been put into your produce market program. You have made a positive contribution to your community's health and well-being."

# **Considering Ways to Support Immigrants**

Church Council has appointed **Julie Johnson** to lead a new ministry group to explore ways Redeemer can support those seeking to immigrate legally to or to remain legally in the United States. "We should all know that the ELCA is a 'Sanctuary Denomination' having voted in 2019, at Churchwide Assembly, to do that," Julie points out. "In its simplest form, becoming a sanctuary denomination means that the ELCA is publicly declaring that walking alongside immigrants and refugees is a matter of faith. It's important to know that there is no legal definition of 'sanctuary.' The ELCA guidance is that individual churches or synods can determine their own ways of being sanctuary.

"One immediate way that individuals and Redeemer can walk along with immigrants at this critical time is by supporting CRIS Ohio. The Community Refugee and Immigration Services (CRIS) is a nonprofit agency in Central Ohio that provides a variety of services to refugees and immigrants. It is an affiliate of Church World Services (which Redeemer supports each fall through CROP Walk – see separate story, this issue on CROP Walk).

"The quickest way to support CRIS is directly through either their website at <u>crisohio.org</u> or by calling 614-235-5747. You can also donate by writing a check to Redeemer and note in the memo line CRIS. Donations through Redeemer are usually delayed by at least a month.

"Another way that Redeemer is walking alongside immigrants is to be of assistance to those who worship with us. Whether through transportation to church, providing a bulletin in their language, connecting them to needed services or helping with daily needs, we have opportunities to help."
